25th September

AZARA, September 30: Girijananda Chowdhury University (GCU) marked World Pharmacists Day on 25th September 2024 based on the theme 'Pharmacist: Meeting Global Health Needs". The event, organized by the School of Pharmaceutical Sciences, GCU, Guwahati in collaboration with other allied Schools and NSS Unit-I and Unit-II of the University, aimed to highlight the pivotal role of pharmacists in global health and well-being.

The celebrations commenced with a street play titled "Pharmacy Without Pharmacists: Endangering Human Health" on 23rd September at Gadhuli Bazaar, Azara. The play, performed by students of the School of Pharmaceutical Sciences, underscored the importance of pharmacists in rational drug use and patient care. To further enhance community outreach, a free health camp was organized on the same day at the GCU Wellness Centre, offering free health check-ups and medicines to the local community.

The main event of World Pharmacists Day was held on 25th September. The celebrations began with a flaghoisting ceremony at 9:30 AM, by Shri Jasoda Ranjan Das, President of SSA, along with Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, Prof. Kandarpa Das. A subsequent awareness rally, flagged off by Honourable Chancellor, Prof. Jayanta Deka and Registrar, Prof. Dipankar Saha, of GCU along with the students and faculty members from the university campus to Azara Primary Health Centre, Azara aiming to raise public awareness about the significance of pharmacists and their contributions to the healthcare system.



A formal meeting was held at 11:30 AM, featuring renowned pharmacist and healthcare professional, Mr. Biswajit Talukdar, Drug Controller, Government of Assam as the chief guest and Mr. Yashpal Singh, General Manager, AVIGEN Biopharma, Guwahati as the guest of honour. In their address, they highlighted the challenges faced by pharmacists and emphasized the need for continuous professional development. 

EMPOWERING EDUCATORS: DR. PRITI SARMAH LEADS CAPACITY BUILDING PROGRAM FOR ASSAM'S TEACHERS



AZARA, September 30: Dr. Priti Sarmah, Assistant Professor at the Department of English and Foreign Languages (ENFL), Girijananda Chowdhury University, was invited as a resource person to impart comprehensive training for secondary-level teachers across Assam. The training was part of a four-phase, 6-day Capacity Building Program for English teachers, organized by the Department of English Language Teaching (ELT) of Gauhati University in collaboration with the Samagra Sikshya, Assam.Over the course of the program, Dr. Sarmah imparted valuable insights into the development of soft skills, which are crucial in enhancing teaching efficacy and fostering better learning environments for students. The initiative, which aimed to uplift the skill set of secondary level educators, saw the participation of over 1000 teachers from various regions of Assam.

The capacity-building initiative, spearheaded by Dr. Sarmah, was lauded for its forward-thinking approach in developing soft skills among educators, ultimately contributing to the overall improvement of the educational landscape in Assam.
