GUWAHATI, September 18: On 21st August, 2025, the Centre for Legal Studies at Girijananda Chowdhury University, Guwahati, Assam, organized a one-day workshop on "Philosophy of Criminal Jurisprudence". The workshop featured a lecture by Prof. Anil Kumar Sinha, Retd. Director of Forensic Science, Government of Assam, Former Principal Nerim Law College and Former Dean of the USRL USTM, who emphasized on the criminal philosophy and theories. The Head of the Department, Centre for Legal Studies, GCU, Dr. Niju Moni Das, welcomed everyone and led the opening remarks. Prof. Sinha, a distinguished jurist, provided guidance to LLM students on effective time management and self-management strategies.
