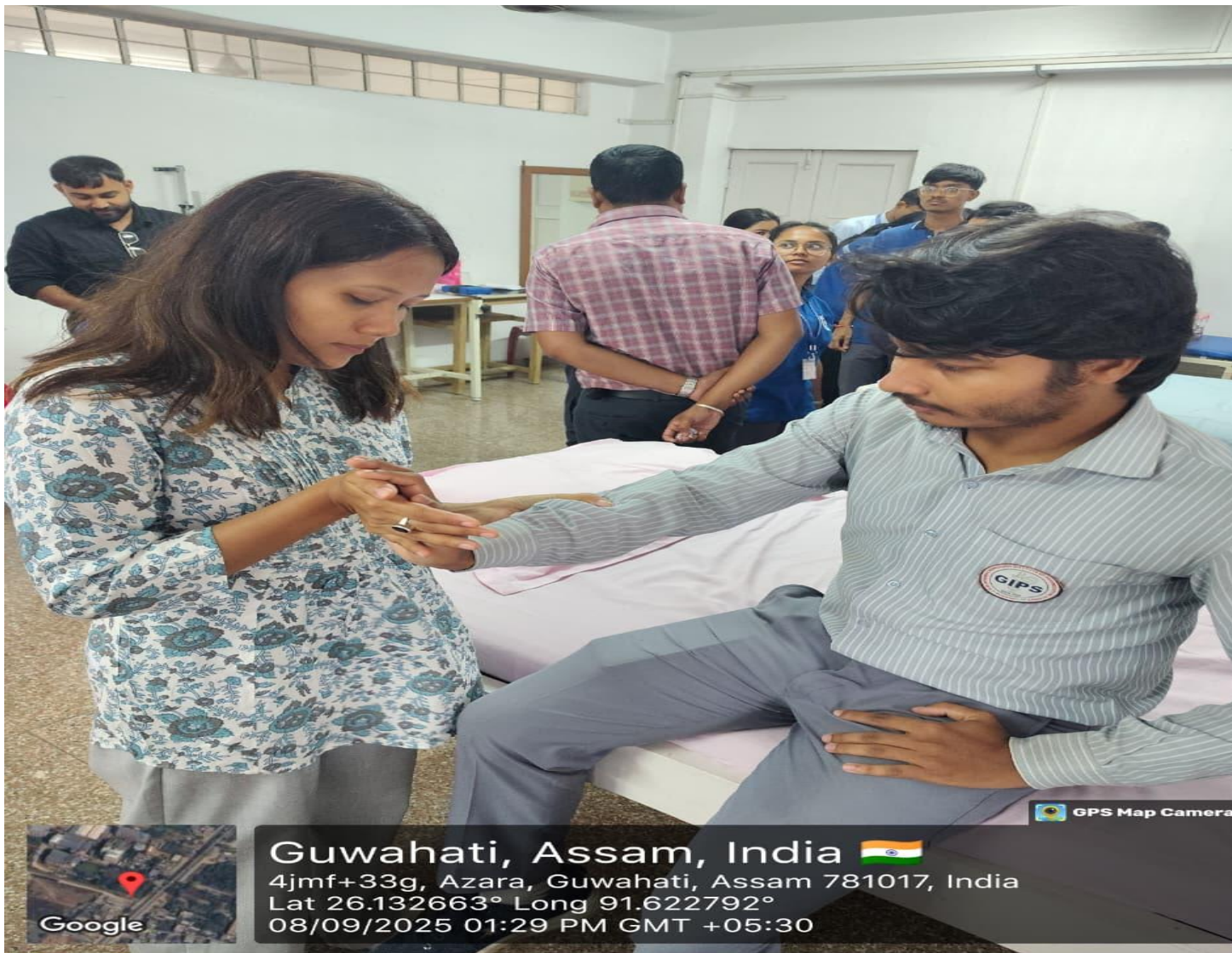
Event Impact:
